**Margaret Grey, DrPH, RN, FAAN**

Margaret Grey is the Dean of the Yale School of Nursing, the Annie Goodrich Professor of Nursing, and Director of the Center for Self and Family Management in Vulnerable Populations at Yale University. She earned the Bachelor of Science degree from the University of Pittsburgh School of Nursing in 1970.

As a nurse practitioner, educator, researcher, and administrator, Dr. Grey has made many extraordinary contributions to the nursing profession. With grants totaling \$20 million, she has led research that has helped children and families better manage type 1 diabetes and prevent type 2 diabetes in high risk youth.

The author of over 200 journal articles, chapters, and abstracts, Dr. Grey is an elected member in the Institute of Medicine of the National Academies and the American Academy of Nursing. She has been an active member and a devoted leader for many health organizations including the American Medical Association, the National Institutes of Health, the National Institute of Nursing Research and the American Diabetes Association. Dr. Grey has earned recognition by having received the Outstanding Nurse Scientist Award from The Council for the Advancement of Nursing Science, a research arm of the American Academy of Nursing in 2008 and the Distinguished Alumni Award from Pitt's School of Nursing in 1999.
