- As a resident of the LLC, you will participate in the University's Emerging Leaders Program which has been designed to complement your classroom and student life experiences by focusing on the behaviors that strengthen your personal effectiveness and leadership development.
- In addition, you will have an opportunity to attend field trips pertaining to nursing and healthcare, participate in professional seminars, facilitate a community service project and interact with accomplished nurses.
